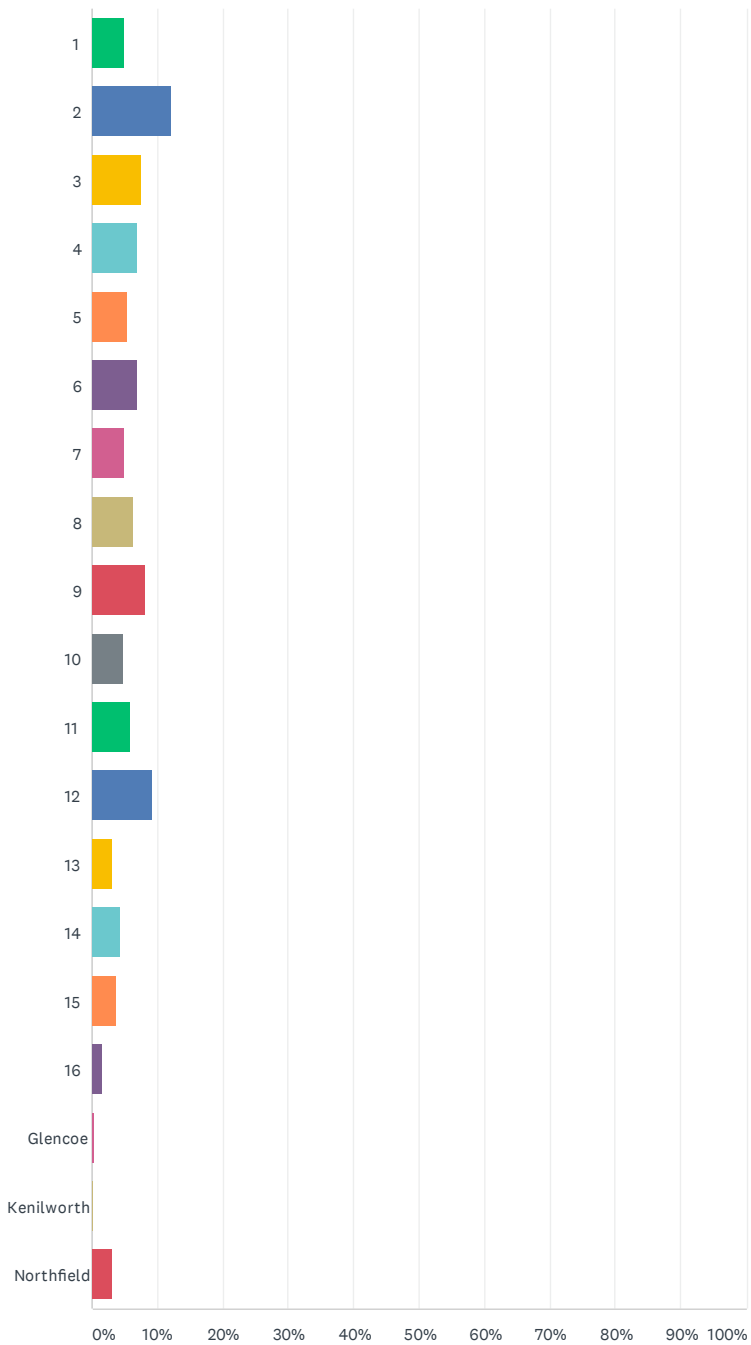


Q1 Your district is your survey passcode. Using the map, please select the district in which you reside.

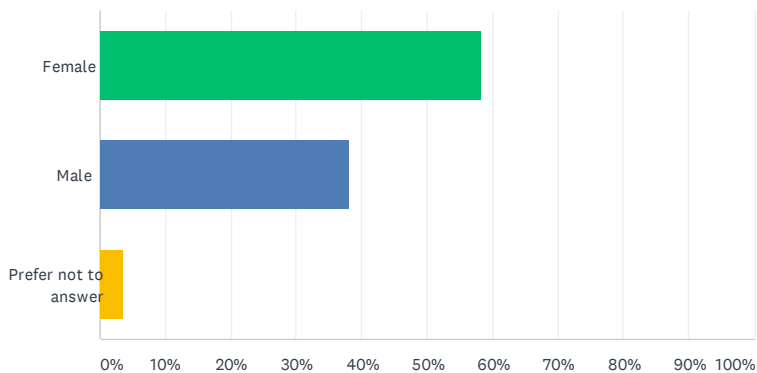

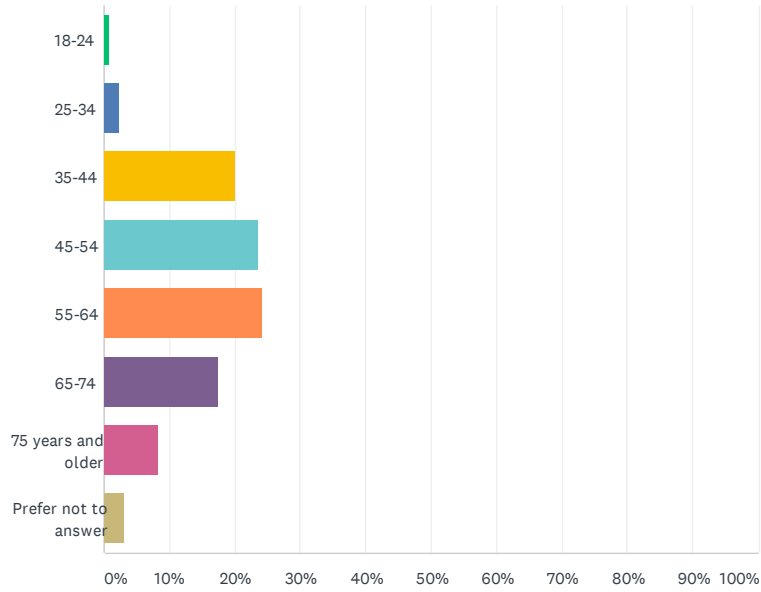

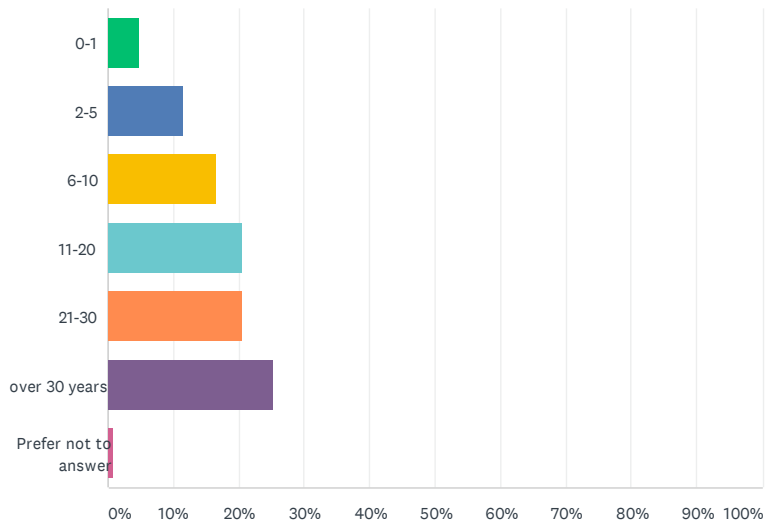

Q4 How many years have you lived in the community?

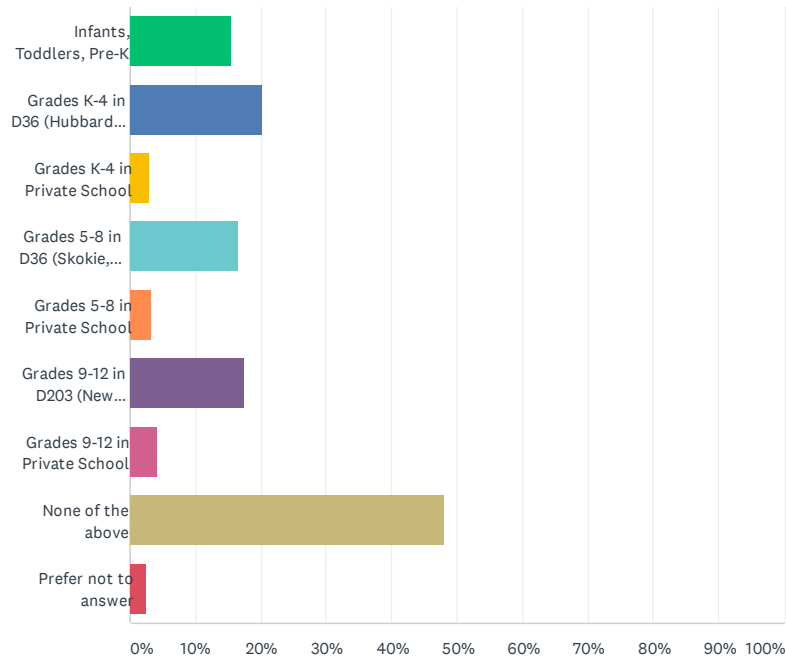

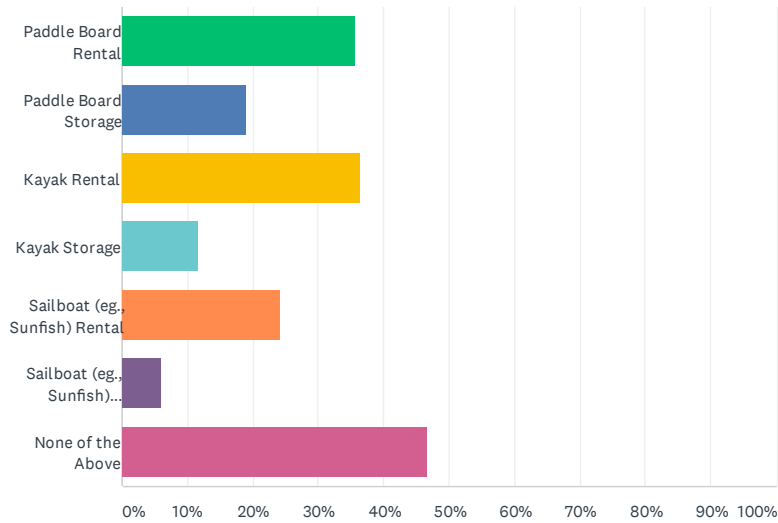

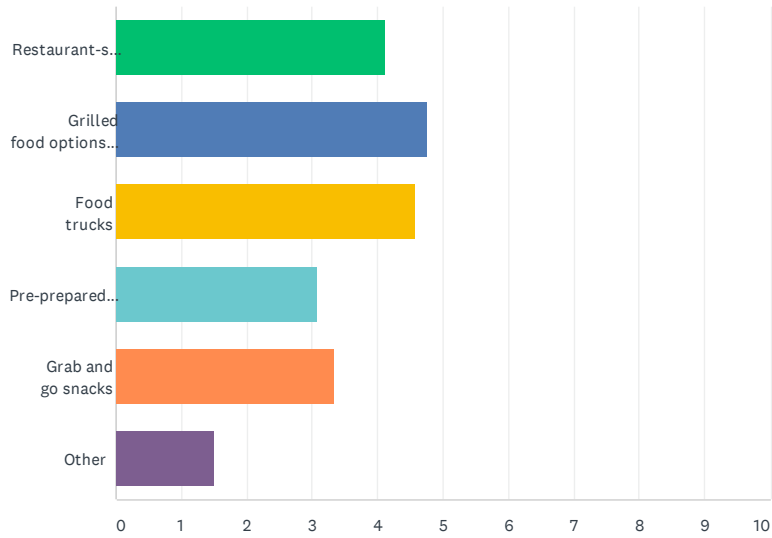

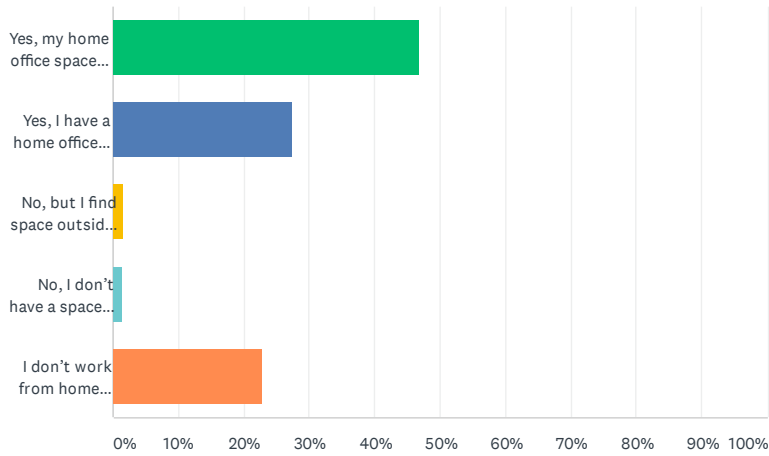

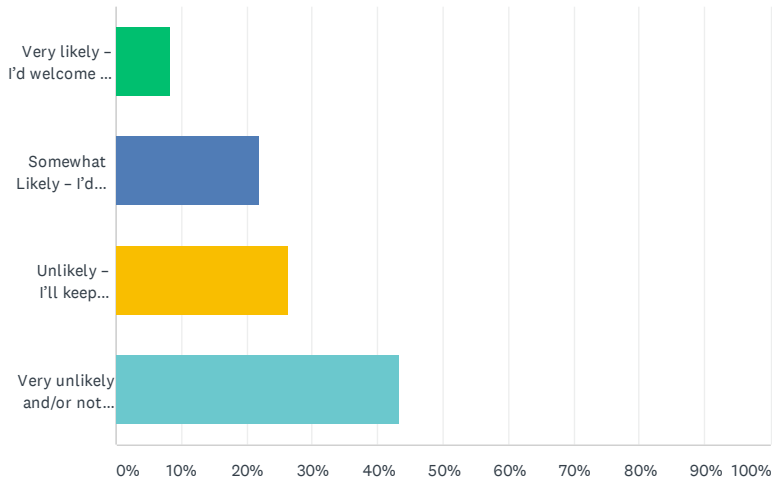

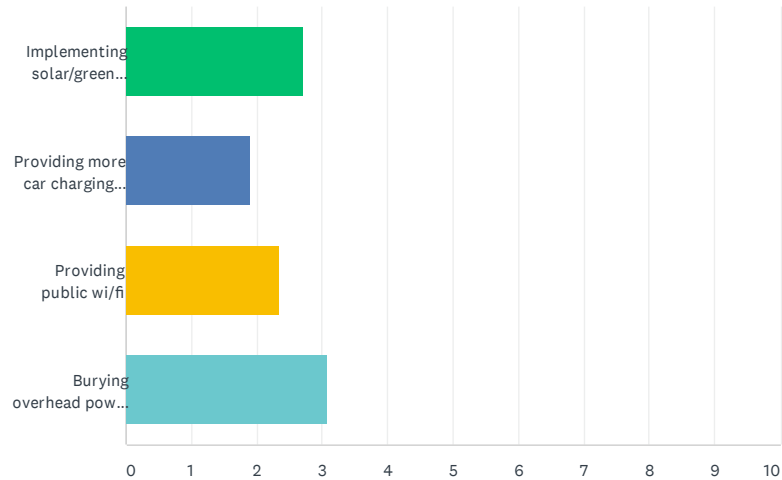

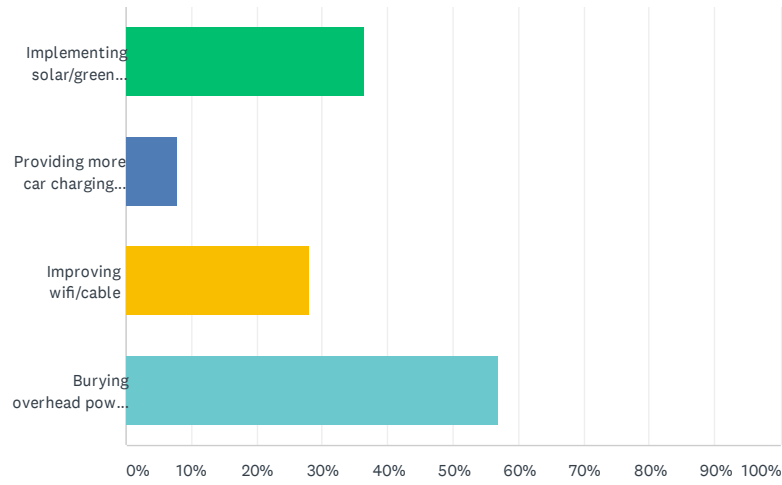

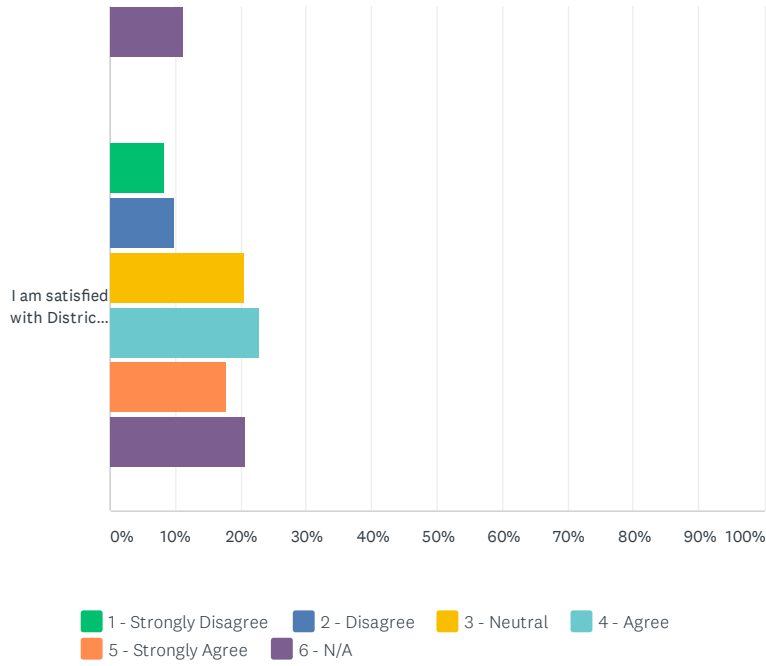

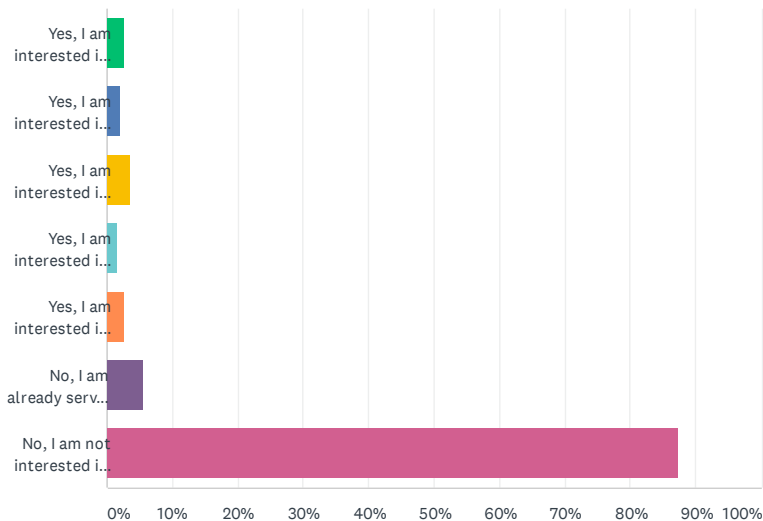
