The Spring Town Hall is an opportunity to see how survey insights, [prior year Caucus Council platforms](#), and Board decisions all come together to shape the Village we call home.

The event will run for 90 minutes. After a brief intro to the WCC, each Board lead will present a 10-15 minute update, and then we will have 30 minutes of panelist-style Q&A.

Updates will cover progress vs. strategic platforms, other important initiatives, and where each board could use more input/insight from the community - great info as we begin to design this year's survey over the summer months.
